



1) God's Love and His Plan



2) Our Sin Problem Causes Separation from God

3) God's Remedy: Jesus' Crucifixion, His Resurrection and the Church




Jesus came as our Savior. Jesus is the only answer to our sin problem – He is our Bridge to God.

What are we to do?

- Acknowledge personal sinfulness and trust Christ's promise of forgiveness. Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and cooperate with His grace to break sinful habits.
- Receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist every Sunday.
- Know that we will face trials & suffering. Jesus asks us to carry our cross and He will be with us.
